

# Cimarron Country Emergency Information

## What Residents Should Do Now

- **Get a kit** – Prepare a kit with at least a three day supply of water, food and other supplies. Place in a covered container or backpack for convenience in case you must evacuate. Store in a convenient, cool location and replace or rotate items periodically as needed. A suggested list is below. More information can be found at <https://www.ready.gov/build-a-kit>

Water - 1 gallon per person per day

Food - non perishable

Manual can opener

Flashlight

Radio – battery powered or hand cranked

NOAA Weather Radio w/tone alert

Extra batteries

First aid kit

First aid and/or emergency reference manual

Moist towelettes

Daily medications and glasses

Cash, traveler's checks and change

Matches in a waterproof container

Mess kits, disposable cups, plates and utensils

Bleach and medicine dropper

Complete change of clothing, including shoes

Personal hygiene items

Whistle

Sleeping bag

Filter mask

Plastic sheeting and duct tape

Garbage bags and plastic ties

Emergency plan and contact information

Important family documents

Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities

Unique family needs for infants, elderly, disabled, etc.

Maps

Cell phone w/chargers, inverter or solar charger

- **Make a plan** – Whether the emergency is a personal one such as a house fire or an area-wide disaster, an emergency plan is important to help you locate family members and communicate with them. Sit down with your family, make a plan, give each family member a copy and periodically review the plan with them. For help in preparing your plan visit <https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan>

- **Stay informed**

**Tune to 99.7 FM (KSTAR COUNTRY) for local emergency information**

**Tune to 740 AM (KTRH) - Emergency Alert System**

**Register for Smart 911** to be notified by phone if emergency situations arise in your area. Call (936) 523-5900 or go to <https://www.mc911.org/page/ecd.smart911>

- **Call 211 NOW** to pre-register a special needs person who would require assistance to evacuate.
- **Enter an ICE contact (In Case of Emergency) in your cell phone** – Emergency personnel are trained to look for contacts named ICE (or ICE1, ICE2, etc.) if you are injured and unresponsive.

# Cimarron Country Emergency Information

## In the event of a community-wide disaster

*(hurricane, tornado, wildfire, flood, explosion, act of terrorism, etc.)*

- The Cimarron Country Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) will gather at the intersection of Cimarron Way and Deer Lodge to determine if it is necessary to activate the Cimarron Country CERT and establish an **Incident Command Post (ICP)**. The **ICP** will function as the hub for all emergency-related activities and as an information portal.
- The **IC (Incident Commander)** will direct the efforts of the Cimarron Country CERT and resident-volunteers. The **IC** is typically the first CERT person to reach the Incident Command Post and will serve until another person assumes command, according to Incident Command System.
- A sign will be posted at the intersection of Cimarron Way and Deer Lodge to indicate that the CERT has been activated.
- Location for the **ICP** will be indicated on the sign.

## Following a disaster, what do residents do?

Once it is safe to do so, all residents should:

- Evaluate your own situation and notify the Cimarron Country CERT of your status.
- Contact the Incident Commander at the Incident Command Post to
  - Report your status (property and family members)
  - Request assistance and/or information (if needed)
  - Volunteer yourself and/or your resources (if you are safe)

*If the Cimarron Country CERT receives a report that you need assistance, they will send a Search & Rescue team to evaluate your situation.*
